The congregation of Ware Church holds its Annual Meeting on Christ the King Sunday, November 20th, beginning at 10:30 a.m. The meeting is a combination of worship, reports and the 2012 Budget review. Four parishioners are to be elected to a three-year term on the Vestry. Additional nominations may be made from the floor. The rules of the meeting require that those voting for the Vestry must be present at the meeting. Many thanks to those who made nominations and to the Nominating Committee of Gilbert Birdsall, Tom Hay, Lisa Lawrence and Fran Musick in presenting this year's slate of candidates:

Elizabeth Hay - She teaches the Kindergarten Sunday School and, if elected, this will be her first term on the Vestry. She and her husband Tom make their home in upper Gloucester.

Colleen Hollenback - She brings a fresh perspective to the leadership of Ware Church as she is new to the congregation. She and her husband, David and their two children make their home in Founders Mill.

Breck Montague - He is a former vestryman and Senior Warden. He and his wife Mary make their home at Toddsbury. Their daughter Molly, who is away at boarding school, received accolades for her dedicated service to the Junior Choir last year.

Lloyd Ward - Lloyd and Kim were married at Ware Church and they have been active members ever since. Their two children, Jacob and Joshua, serve as acolytes and sing in the Junior Choir.

Christian Education



The news of the supplement of *Seasons of Creation* didn't require any fanfare but I quietly celebrated with pride at Ware Church. The announcement read, "Many congregations have begun to think deeply about the kind of message they want to convey through their worship, Christian education, and outreach practices to a world facing significant challenges." I knew this was not a novel idea. Ware Church Sunday school has been practicing our version of "Creation" for the past three years by planting bulbs, establishing the Butterfly Garden and being good stewards through delivering care packages to the shut-ins and nursing homes.

Season of Creation resources and the footwork they provide for our Bible lesson plans is a welcomed addition to our teachers. Under the supervision of Ceci Brown, the second Sundays will be devoted to (4) Seasons of Creation: Forest, Wilderness, Land and Rivers. The Sunday readings not only have been prepared to correspond with the liturgical sequence of Matthew, Mark and Luke but also to incorporate the Spirit, the Word and the Wisdom in creation to grow in faith.

The November 13th topic is Forest Sunday. The readings *Acts 17:22-28*, *Genesis 2:4b-22*, *Psalms 139:13-26* and *John 3:1-16* for the day contain the Bible's oldest ideas about the role of the forest in the world. Our guest will be Mrs. Shot Tabb of Ware Neck, who will bring her parrot, Clyde. We are delighted to have them and to bring the rainforest to life.

As one parent said recently, "I was a member of another church and I had the opportunity to visit Ware. I heard the sermon by Peter Worthington and he 'talked' to me. Because of that I joined the church." That is what makes Ware so unique. We all share the same vision and commitment in the formation of our Christian education. We are blessed to have good leaders and the love and support of the parents to make this a vibrant learning and worship environment.

"I love chapel!" a Sunday school student exclaimed. Our congregation has embraced the new addition of Episcopalian trivia, as announced in last month's *Grapevine*. Peter Worthington, rector, has enchanted the Sunday school classes with church trivia. Each week, from history to present day, he stirs their imagination to create a deeper biblical understanding to utilize in their continued Christian Education. The Adult Forum has met on the 2nd floor of the Parish House for the past weeks to discuss topics from resources including newspapers, *Forward Day by Day*, *Do the Right Things*, *Fast That I Choose*, *Synthesis CE*, *Education for Ministry*, *Parallel*, *Marcus Borg Series* and *Seasons of the Spirit*. Music at Ware

Communion Hymns



Ever wonder about the “extra” Communion hymns sung by the Senior Choir? They are from the “Lift Every Voice and Sing” African American Hymnal. About a year ago these hymnals were purchased for use by the Senior Choir to provide supplemental anthems and other service music. This hymnal is particularly rich in Communion hymns. Some of the favorites are “Taste and See”, “One Bread, One Body” and “In Remembrance of Me.”

Dr. James E. Moore, Jr. wrote “Taste and See”, one of the most loved of Communion hymns. He is a Virginian, native to LaCrosse. He is a composer, conductor, pianist and master teacher, and currently lives in Vienna, Austria. The music to “Taste and See” contains a recurring refrain in four-part harmony, which alternates with three verses in unison. It is one of the Senior Choir favorites.

One of the latest Communion hymns added to the Senior Choir repertoire is “One Bread, One Body”, composed by Jesuit Father John Foley. He is a liturgical and classical composer, theologian, liturgist and writer. In 1993, he was appointed Director of the Center for Liturgy at St. Louis University. He lectures throughout the country on liturgy and liturgical music. His “One Bread, One Body” is noteworthy for its lyrics of inclusiveness. It, too, has a refrain that alternates with verses. The gentleness of the melodic line coupled with the amazing lyrics makes this a hymn that will certainly stand the test of time.

Buryl Red is a composer who has garnered national recognition. He was described by the Washington Post as “uncommonly creative.” He is a composer, conductor, producer and arranger. His venues range from Carnegie Hall to Saturday Night Live to churches and schools. He is the executive record producer for a widely used music series in public schools, the Silver Burdett Making Music series. He was born in Little Rock, Arkansas and now lives in New York City. His hymn, “In Remembrance of Me” was composed in 1972 and has become a standard among Communion hymns. The four-part harmony is rich and supports the amazing lyrics.

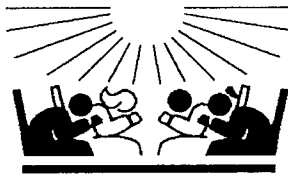
These three incredible hymns are treasures. They will surely stand the “test of time” and become an integral part of the Episcopal musical heritage. The Senior Choir is very pleased to sing these hymns during the distribution of the Eucharist as a supplement to the congregational Communion hymns.

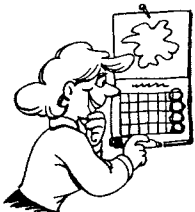
Women of Ware

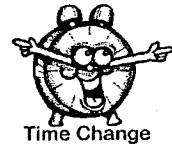

November Mission Ministries

African Jewelry Sale November 6th is the African jewelry sale. It is held in the Parish Hall after the early service and after the late service. This is a fantastic opportunity to pick up some unique Christmas gifts—necklaces, earrings and more! The proceeds go to the African Team Ministries to assist with health and education ministries.



The **United Thank Offering (UTO)** addresses compelling human need through grants to projects that alleviate poverty, both domestically and internationally, within the Anglican provinces, dioceses, and companion dioceses. In the last 5 years, the Diocese of Virginia contributed about \$155,000 per year to the United Thank Offering. UTO envelopes are included in the November 6th bulletin.

Angel Tree: Each year Ware sponsors the Angel Tree project. Our tree will be in the Parish Hall by Sunday, November 20th. Please come by and pick out your “ornaments”. List the information and your name on the sign-up sheets near the tree. We need to have the gifts returned by noon on December 18th.

The First Sunday of the month is Food Pantry Sunday, when Ware helps to restock the shelves of the Salvation Army Food Pantry. This month is a **Thanksgiving Food Offering**. We are asking you to bring Thanksgiving type food that can be packaged together for families for dinner on that special day. Suggestions would be sweet potatoes or yams, canned apples, pie crust mix, mashed potatoes, cranberry sauce/jelly, stuffing mix and anything else that could be used for Thanksgiving. These items will be collected during the first weeks of November. We are also helping two Ware families with Thanksgiving type items plus staples, e.g., coffee, tea, sugar, cocoa, paper products, canned meats and vegetables, and any other donations you would like to bring.
